

## **CHILDREN & MINORS (UNDER 18)**

## **EXCERPT FROM LIQUOR ACT 2007:**

'Minors, or under 18s, are permitted to enter registered clubs in line with the club's rules. Minors must:

- o Remain in the company and immediate presence of a member who is a responsible adult, such as a parent or guardian, or other person who is standing in as a parent.
- o Leave the club when the member does, or earlier.

Minors aren't permitted to enter or stay in the bar area of a club or hotel, unless they are accompanied by a responsible adult and are:

- o Passing through the area to gain access to another area of the club.
- o Performing in the bar area as part of a show.
- Attending a wedding reception of a member (or that member's child or parent), or invited by a person entitled to issue an invitation.'
- The Responsible Supervising Adult is to ensure that their children behave in an appropriate manner when on Club premises and refrain from behaviour which is likely to cause discomfort or inconvenience to other patrons. Such behaviour includes but is not limited to: screaming, running around unsupervised between tables, swearing, intimidating, and pushing or conflicts with other children.
- o Shoes must be always worn inside the club, unless on the bowling green under supervision.
- o Parents and Guardians are requested to accompany their children to the toilets
- o Children & Minors must maintain a responsible distance (1.5 metres) from all areas where liquor is served and prohibited from access to gaming areas.
- o Children and Minors must leave the premises by 9pm.

## CHILDREN ON THE GREENS

- o Children are not permitted on the bowling greens when lawn bowls are in play.
- o Waverley Greens requests that bowls equipment, rink markers, rink numbers, surrounding gardens any other moveable object are not used inappropriately with the assistance of parents and guardians, appropriately supervised in compliance with the Liquor Act 2007.
- o Food, Drink and sports other than bowls are prohibited on the greens.

Failure to adhere to these requests may result in the Minor and their accompanying Responsible Adult being asked to leave the Club premises.
